### BEING A PERSON

We believe in one God: Father, Son and Spirit.

There is absolute individuality within the Trinity, for we believe that the Father is neither the Son nor the Spirit, nor is the Son the Father or the Spirit, nor is the Spirit the Father or the Son. Each person is distinct from the other two; none loses his personhood within the Trinity.

There is absolute equality within the Trinity. No person has something that the others lack, for each is God and each is all being. None is more God; all are absolutely equal.

There is absolute unity within the Trinity. God is one; the three persons are one. Father, Son and Spirit are three distinct persons, but they are persons in one God.

Ours is a Trinitarian religion. The Trinity is the source of our faith as well as the goal of our lives. We long to live for all eternity the life of the Trinity. Meanwhile, the Trinity is for us the model towards which we strive as a community: free individuals with total equality in complete unity.

Christians look forward in hope to a true communion among all persons with each other and with God. The Spirit of Christ labors in history to build up the bonds of solidarity among all persons until that day on which their union is brought to perfection in the Kingdom of God. Indeed Christian theological reflection on the very reality of God as a trinitarian unity of persons—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—shows that being a person means being united to other persons in mutual love.

## WE NEED YOUR INPUT

As most everyone knows by now, we will be going from 3 priests to 2 as of June 26th. The universal law of the Church (Canon Law) mandates that priests should only be celebrating 1 Mass per day, 2 for absolute need on Sundays. Fr. Haley and I have discussed the changing of the Mass schedule on Sunday with the Liturgy Commission and the Parish Council and now it is time to get the input of you, the people of the parish.

The current Mass schedule for Monday thru Saturday will **not** change at this point, but we are looking at changing Sunday mornings to either:

**7:30 am, 9:30 am and 11:30 am - OR - 8:00 am, 10:00 am and 12 noon**

The Sunday evening Mass will continue, but at 5:30 pm instead of 6:00 pm. The musicians and the youth minister are all in agreement of this slight move, and, it allows for the teen-agers to get home a little earlier on Sunday evenings to get ready for school on Monday.

If you have a preference, please mark the form below and place it in the collection basket no later than the weekend of June 9th and 10th. The new Mass schedule will be announced the weekend of June 19th and 20th.

## FORMED KIDS' KORNER

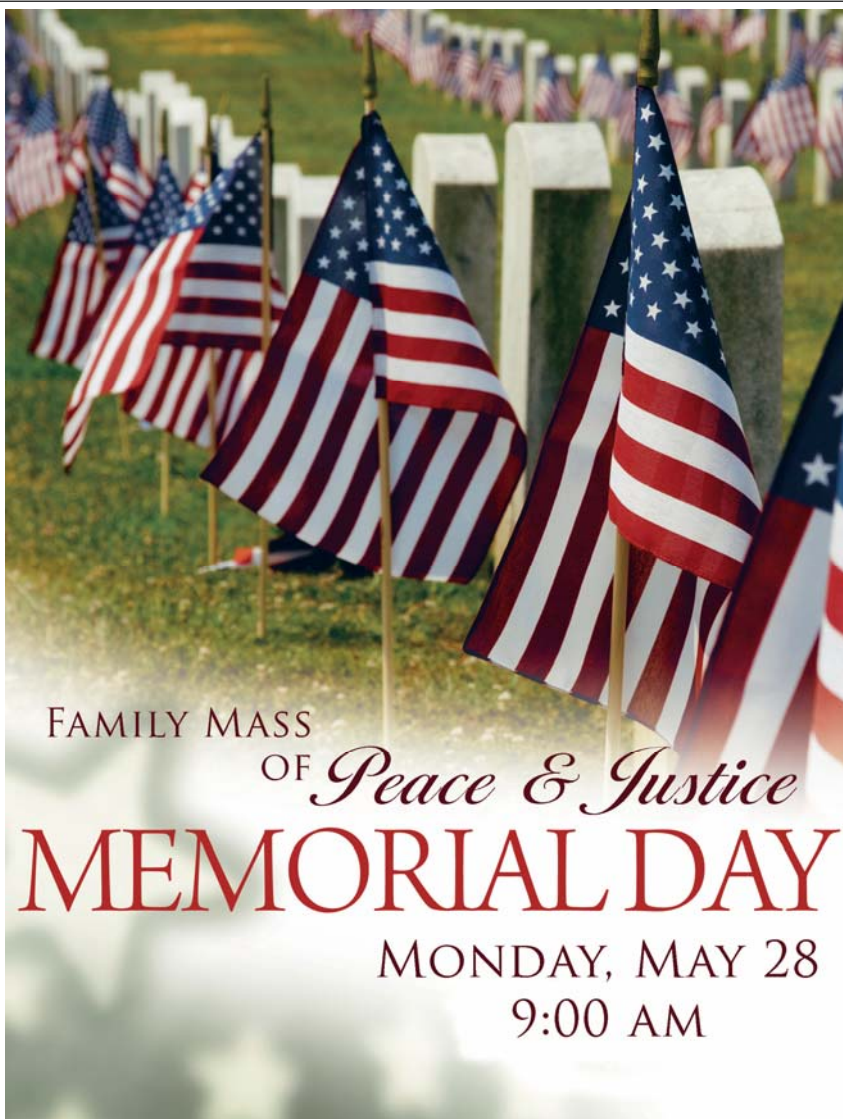

### THE VISITATION

This coming Wednesday, May 31, the Church celebrates the Visitation of Mary to her cousin Elizabeth. It is a wonderful feast that reminds us of the humanity of Mary. Mary was a part of a family who loved her. When she found herself in an unexpected pregnancy, and discovered that Elizabeth in her old age had also conceived a child (the future John the Baptist), Mary immediately set forth to visit Elizabeth and to offer her support. The Gospel of Luke says that Mary spent three months with Elizabeth and then returned home.

One thing that has always struck me is how much women support each other during challenging times. Women care for each other during pregnancies. They celebrate together, they grieve together. Most recently I witnessed this when my nephew passed away. My sister in Wisconsin and my sister in Oklahoma immediately left to be with my sister here in Saint Louis, and they spent several days offering her support, tears, and laughter. They cleaned the house and they arranged for food. They made a hard week a little more bearable, and they have always been that way with each other.



Here at Sacred Heart it is the same way. As I write this, I just came away from the funeral luncheon for Joe Finder. The women of the Funeral Luncheon Committee turned out with a beautiful array of food which they offer free of charge. This is no "lightweight" ministry...sometimes they do it two or three times in the same week, and they start in the morning and sometimes are there until midafternoon. But these women regard it as an important ministry of the parish, and it certainly is. It brings a lot of comfort to grieving families, some of whom are still stunned by the loss of a loved one. One of the things that really impresses me is how each year the women gather together for a retreat, to make sure they have the spiritual renewal necessary for so vital a ministry. It is one more example of how women pull together during times of need.

It is always a dangerous thing to make generalizations about either sex, but women have a special gift for being relational. They make connections, they deepen emotional bonds between people. I've spent much of my life in seminaries and other environments that were primarily made up of men, and what a difference it makes when women are brought in to collaborate in ministry and to take part in leadership. It changes the dynamic. I think the Church is finally realizing this and hopefully, women will continue to be appointed to leadership positions at every level of Church life. It balances things out and underscores the reality that together, male and female, we reflect God's Image.

For this reason, the Visitation is an important reminder to us of how much we need to come together and support each other in the events of our lives. This coming May 31, I suggest going online and looking at a couple of artist renderings of the Visitation of Mary to Elizabeth. Spend a few minutes contemplating how the two loved and supported each other. Celebrating this feast day well can bring us to a deeper sense of how we are all—male and female—called to love and support one another.
