THE SOURCE OF OUR DEEPEST COMMITMENT

Israel ratified its covenant with God in blood, half of which the priest splashed on the altar, the other half on the people. Jesus passed around the wine, which he called, "my blood, the blood of the covenant." Like the blood of the old covenant, it was poured out on the altar (of the cross), but unlike the blood of the old covenant, it was drunk by the people.

The priest offered up the "body" of the sacrificial animal as a "peace offering to the Lord." Jesus gave the disciples bread, which he called *my body*, but only after he had broken it.

Jesus thus leads us in the direction of giving ourselves totally for others. He pours out his blood for love of the world; he offers his broken body for love of the world; and then he has us consume these signs of love, to make them part of us so that we will make our own the total commitment to others expressed in the sacrifice of the cross.

Jesus became "mediator of a new covenant" by shedding his own blood. We follow Jesus into this new covenant by offering ourselves up totally for the well-being of our brother and sister humans.

The quest for human freedom and justice is not optional for Catholics, nor is it a small part of the Church's mission. Participation in the struggle for freedom and justice is a duty for each one of us, as it is a central element of the Church's mission of redemption and liberation. In the Eucharist we find the source of our deepest commitment to the loving service of our brothers and sisters.

FEAST OF THE BODY AND BLOOD OF JESUS

This weekend the Church celebrates the Feast of Corpus Christi, the Body and Blood of Jesus. It is a feast that dates back to the 13th century, when a Norbertine nun by the name of Juliana of Liege experienced an apparition of Jesus, who asked that a special feast be instituted dedicated to His Body and Blood. Pope Urban IV officially established the Feast of Corpus Christi in 1264, which was to be celebrated on the Thursday following Pentecost (here in the United States, it is moved to the following Sunday). Throughout the world, many churches hold Corpus Christi processions to celebrate the feast, and our liturgy is especially joyful on this day.

While we as a Church celebrate Corpus Christi annually, I think it is important to remember that every Eucharistic liturgy is a feast of the Body and Blood of Jesus. What's more, it is vital that we remember that the Body of Christ is more than the consecrated Host (which we certainly believe is the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus). In a very meaningful way, the Church itself is the Body of Christ, and the Eucharist is meant to nourish us so that we can share Christ with others. We are His hands and feet in the world today. We receive Eucharist so that we can in turn minister to a troubled world.

Eucharistic adoration is an important way in which we worship Christ. But one thing the Church has made very clear: Eucharist adoration flows out of the liturgy, and when we adore Christ in the Eucharist, it should make us hunger all the more to receive Christ and to minister to Him in the poor and disadvantaged of the world. If we spend time with Christ in the Eucharist and don't come away with a deeper desire to share what we have received with others, then there is a problem. Saint John Chrysostom (349-407), one of the Church Fathers, once wrote the following: "Do you want to honor Christ's body? Do not neglect him when he is naked; do not, while you honor him here with silken garments, neglect him perishing outside of cold and nakedness. For he that said 'This is my body,' and by his word confirmed the fact, also said 'You saw me hungry and you did not feed me,' and 'Whatever you did for one of the least of these, you did for me.'...Let us learn therefore to be strict in life, and to honor Christ as He Himself desires." These are important words...Jesus himself tells us in Matthew 25 that our very salvation hinges upon whether or not we are willing to see him in the less fortunate.

A wonderful way of celebrating Corpus Christi would be to take a few minutes to reflect on where the Body of Christ is in the world today. If we take the Gospel seriously, we won't have to look far. He is in the hungry, the lonely, the homeless. He is in the undocumented immigrant. He is in the drug addict and the young person who has lost his way. Christ is all around us, if we have the eyes to see him. To reflect on that reality this Corpus Christi and then to spend some time discerning how to serve Christ today would be a powerful way to grow in grace and holiness. The Body of Christ is one of the greatest mysteries of our Faith. To receive Eucharist is to receive the Body of Christ glorified...but from there, we go forth to connect with the Body of Christ that is broken and hurting in the world. And both encounters with Christ are necessary for us to truly understand who Jesus really is.

Two Pilots Spent Their Savings on a Plane to Rescue Migrants at Sea



CEDEX, FR - Two pilots have spent their combined life savings for the sole purpose of saving refugees from the perils of sailing across the Mediterranean Sea.

José Benavente and Benoit Micolon are the French altruists behind the volunteer rescue group Pilotes Volontaires. The two men launched the effort after they pooled their hard-earned money to purchase a \$150,000 plane to be used for rescuing migrants at sea.

"José and I bought the plane with our own personal money because otherwise we would have wasted too much time searching for financing," Micolon told NBC News.

Benavente is no stranger to humanitarian efforts – for 25 years, he's worked for the Red Cross and witnessed the challenges faced by Syrian migrants. Micolon, who first met Benavente in 2006 when they were earning their pilots' licenses, became interested in the cause after his friend described firsthand the refugee crisis.

Every year, thousands of refugees pile into boats as a means of reaching safety in Europe. Unfortunately, many of those vessels don't make it to dry land.
